Sub: REVISED ADDITIONAL District-wise tri-monthly State Allotment Order of Rice for families under the State Food Security Scheme (SFSS) for the month of November December 2019 & January 2020.

Ref: This Department letter No 17928 Dated 19.11.19.

Madam/Sir,

I am directed to communicate the district wise revised additional tri-monthly allocation of **35,047.65 quintals of rice** from State Pool for distribution among the eligible beneficiaries under the **State Food Security Scheme (SFSS)** for the month of **November December 2019 & January 2020** as per enclosed Annexure-I.

All Marketing Inspectors should ensure that these families are physically available. If any complaint comes regarding ghost cards, then MI concerned will be personally held responsible and the cost of grains will be recovered from him/her.

The scale of distribution of rice under the State Food Security Scheme (SFSS) is 5 Kgs per person per month @ Re.1/- per Kg. THE ALLOTTED STOCKS OF RICE SHOULD BE RELEASED ONLY TO THOSE FAIR PRICE SHOPS WHICH HAVE VALID FPS LICENSE/RENEWAL FOR THE FINANCIAL YEAR 2018-19 (TILL MARCH 2019) AND FOR 2019-20.

It is observed that there has been irrational tagging of FPS done during digitization of applications under the State Food Security Scheme which has resulted in tagging of excessive of number of FPSs than that of Dealers distributing foodgrains under NFSA. The concerned RCMS authorities may be directed to tag the SFSS ration cards to Dealers distributing NFSA foodgrains only. Inspectors of Supplies/MIs should be directed to ensure lifting of the allotted stocks of SFSS rice by those Dealers engaged for distribution of foodgrains under NFSA and simultaneously give effect to ration card tagging in SFSS so that distribution of rice in all FPSs can be made along with NFSA foodgrains.

Distribution of stocks should be made only through e-PoS devices. However, in case of any exigencies or in worst circumstances, manual mode of distribution should be resorted to only after due approval of concerned ADM, BDO/EO or CSO with proper justification. In such case, the stock/sales records must be kept for future reference/verification & the physical balance should be entered by Marketing Inspectors in the FPS portal for the concerned Fair Price Shop (FPS) at the end of the distribution.

CSO is to download the Block/ULB/FPS-wise FPS wise allotment from the system in CSO login of OTPDS URL <u>www.pdsodisha.gov.in</u> (Allotment under SFSS link given in MIS Report section) and communicate it along with the State Allotment Order letter issued from the Department to the concerned BDOs/Sub Collectors/ADMs with copy to EO of ULBs for further action at their level. Concerned Blocks & ULBs can also download the FPSwise allotment of rice under SFSS in their respective RCMS login in above OTPDS URL. The FPS-wise Sales Registers have also been generated as per the above allocations and made available in the RCMS login for the Blocks and ULBs to download and use during manual transaction if any. The FPS-wise Sales Register will also been made available for download in the e-PoS devices to carry out distribution of food grain entitlement of beneficiaries. This should be downloaded in PoS device on or after 1st date of the allotment month and distribution should be made accordingly through PoS device.

- I. Minimum 25% verification of sale will be conducted by the Inspector of Supplies/ACSO in charge of the Block/ULB every month.
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 - II. The distribution of food grains may be undertaken as per the dateline mentioned in the table below during which all the dealers will keep their shops open and keep sufficient stock for the Consumers.
 - III. Undistributed allotment of food grains will be considered as Opening Balance while finalising the allotment for next allotment month (s).
 - IV. Certificate of GPLAC or WLAC will be obtained on proper distribution of food grains every month and submitted to the BDO/Sub Collector/ADM under counter signature of Inspector of Supplies/ACSO as per Annexure-1 of DSS Guidelines.
 - V. Out of the total allotment in favour of Gajapati district, the allotment for Garadama GP under Mohana Block of Gajapati district is diverted to Rayagada district for distribution among the PHH & AAY beneficiaries of the above GP. The CSO, Rayagada is requested to ensure lifting of the above quantities of rice and wheat from Gudari Block for smooth distribution among the genuine beneficiaries of Garadama GP under Mohana Block of Gajapati district.
